# Why change our training?

The Vision Committee's report on *Future Policing*, published in 2005, states i.a:

"The education of the Danish Police should be modernised to ensure an overall improvement of the competency development in the Danish Police

This applies both for the Basic Training at the Police School and for the continuation-training and further education within the police. As far as possible, the educational system in the police should approach the established educational system in Denmark."

# Key elements of the new education


- Problem based learning (PBL)



# Also an employment.....

When you are accepted as a student at the Danish National Police College, you also become a police officer employed on probation in the Danish National Police.

For one thing, this means that the student has to be able to act with full police authority during the practical training modules.

For this reason it is crucial (also) to maintain focus on:

- Capacity for action
- Practical skills
- Framing legislation etc.

# Contents of the basic education modules

#### Module 1

3 quarters equalling 33 weeks of tuition

#### Module 2

2 quarters (22 weeks) of practical training in the police districts. Primarily focus on patroling/policing

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Module 3

2 quarters equalling→ 22 weeks of tuition

#### **Module 4**

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2 quarters (22 weeks) practical training in the police districts. Primarily focus on local investigation

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#### Module 5

3 quarters equalling 22 weeks of tuition and 11 weeks of independent project work



What should be learned?


The curriculum specifies the learning goals for the practical training modules.

# Module 2 Primary focus on patroling/policing

- 12 weeks with a training adviser
- 5 days special patrol
- 5 days preventive work in general
- 5 study days
- 5 subject days
- 2 days synopsis



# Module 4 Primary focus on investigation

- 10 weeks advanced investigation
- 4 weeks case handling, assessment and decision
- 5 days preventive work (cross-disciplinary cooperation)
- 5 study days
- 5 subject days
- 8 days field study


